What We Do

Scholarships

The Foundation grants scholarships to the Kachemak Bay Campus of the U of A each semester for:

- Two students seeking a degree as a Certified CNA, and
- Two students pursuing a degree in other related health care fields.

Education & Training

The Foundation supports a wide range of educational programs to train staff, health care personnel, and health caregivers. Funds also support community health information, wellness programs, speakers & seminars.

Hospital Capital Improvements

The Foundation assists in funding capital improvement projects that are not included in the general operating budget.

Gifts & Donations

The Foundation supports the hospital by investing, managing, and using gifts to the Hospital in accordance with the purposes stated in our articles of incorporation.

Our Goals

Current Goals

The Foundation is dedicated to continuing our efforts to benefit the people of the southern Kenai Peninsula and support the mission of the hospital. Our goals for the coming year include:

- Continuing the **scholarship program**, which awards scholarships each semester to two students seeking degrees as certified nursing assistants. It also provides \$500 scholarships to two students pursuing a degree in other related health care fields.
- Continuing to support the **Health Fair**, which is one of the largest health events on the Kenai Peninsula, and offers affordable health screenings and information.
- Supporting the hospital's effort to complete a comprehensive **community health assessment**.
- Partnering with other agencies and organizations to support a community-wide **diabetes program**, in an effort to combat one of our community's most prevalent diseases.
- Continuing to support **health education and training**. This fund supports a wide range of educational programs to train staff and health care personnel and health caregivers. Proceeds may be used for community health information, wellness programs, speakers and seminars.
- Continuing to support hospital **capital improvements**. This fund assists the hospital in funding small capital improvement projects not included in the operating budgets.

In addition to the goals specific to the giving program, the Foundation also hopes to grow membership and create broader community input and participation.
