

South Peninsula Hospital Long Term Care in Homer, Alaska, offers residence to 28 individuals. Our facility currently provides long term care. Short-term, Medicare-based transitional care is provided by South Peninsula Hospital's Swing Bed Program. This short-term service can assist patients regain independence after surgery, illness or injury, as well as ongoing, round-the-clock nursing care. If someone cannot be discharged safely from the Swing Bed Program, they may be eligible for long term care.

At our Long Term Care facility, we believe our work is about more than providing care 24 hours a day. We practice resident-centric care and value family engagement. We also ask involvement in the residents' care conferences. Giving hope and overcoming fear to help residents adapt is paramount in our practice. We relate to our residents as people in a home-like environment. We celebrate life for the remarkable journey it has been, and cherish the experiences still to come.
